



California and Nevada teams capture titles at WTT Rec League Qualifier in Irvine, Calif. *Six teams advance to National Finals in November*

IRVINE, CALIF. (October 1, 2007) – Recreational tennis teams from California and Nevada captured regional championship titles this weekend at the World TeamTennis Rec League National Qualifier at Heritage Park in Irvine, Calif.

The Irvine tournament is the fifth national qualifying event of the year for the World TeamTennis Rec League presented by Advanta. The winning teams in each division advance to the WTT National Finals, Nov. 1-4 in Indian Wells, Calif., where they will battle champions from five other qualifying events.

California teams dominated the event, winning five of the six division titles. The High Strung Nutts of Las Vegas, Nev., were the only team not based in California to capture a championship. The Nutts won the 3.5 Division title with a 28-19 win over the Tulsa Long Shots of Tulsa, Okla.

In the 3.0 Division, Overruled Again posted a 3-0 round robin record to win the title. Captained by Arash Samadini of Santa Ana, Calif., Overruled Again won a pivotal match over runner-up NCETTC of National City, Calif., 32-27, to finish without a loss. This is the team's first trip to the National Finals.

Give Us a Break of San Diego, Calif., won the 4.0 Division with a 29-25 victory over The Hard Eights of Las Vegas. Tiffany Worst, captain of Give Us A Break, led the team to their second consecutive National Finals appearance.

Another San Diego team took home the title in the 4.5 Division. The Givers, led by captain Scott Dahl, went 3-0 to win their division. En route to the championship, The Givers topped runner-up Hilton Tornados 27-23. The Givers and the Hilton Tornados both play in the same local league in San Diego.

Bay Park Breakers won the Senior 4.0 Division title. The San Diego-based team was undefeated in round-robin action, winning all four of their matches. The Diehards of Long Beach, Calif., finished second with a 2-2 record. This is the first trip for the Breakers to the National Finals.

Fresno Tennis Club returns to the National Finals by winning the Senior 3.5 Division title. Dave Colby of Kingsburg, Calif., is captain of the Fresno Tennis Club squad.

The top teams from the Irvine qualifier face off against the winners from qualifiers in Bradenton, Fla.; St. Louis; Las Vegas; Raleigh, N.C.; Wilmington, Del.; and Irvine, Calif., at the WTT National Finals, Nov. 1-4, at the Indian Wells Tennis Garden in Indian Wells, Calif. The next WTT National Qualifier will be Oct. 6-7 in Wilmington, Del.
