## 2006 WTT Rosters – Substitution List

### **Boston Lobsters:**

Anda Perianu will sub for Nicole Pratt on July 10 (@ Kansas City), July 11 (in Boston), July 13 (@ New York Sportimes); July 14 (in Boston); and July 15 (@Philadelphia). Pratt will miss five matches due to Fed Cup obligations.

#### **Anda Perianu:**

Perianu reached a career high singles ranking of 131 last month on the WTA Tour. The 26-year-old Romanian won six ITF titles in 2005 – three singles (Tampa, El Paso, Houston) and three doubles (El Paso, Houston, Louisville). In 2006, she has posted runner-up finishes in singles at two ITF events. Perianu played on the University of Oklahoma tennis team for four years (2001-04) and still lives and trains in Oklahoma. This is Perianu's WTT debut.

### **Delaware Smash:**

Robbie Koenig is out for the WTT season with a finger injury. He will be replaced by Tres Davis of Austin, Texas for all WTT matches. Smash star Liezel Huber is still in action at Wimbledon in both women's and mixed doubles. Coach Mariaan de Swardt will fill in for Huber on July 6 (in Delaware), July 7 (@ Philadelphia) and July 8 (in Delaware) if Huber is unable to return to the U.S. in time.

#### **Tres Davis:**

This 24-year-old Texas native has won one Futures singles title and nine Futures doubles titles including four victories in 2005. As a junior player, Davis advanced to three Grand Slam Junior Doubles Finals, including the 2000 Australian Open Junior Doubles championship match with Andy Roddick. In 2005, Davis teamed with Roddick at the U.S. Claycourts to post an impressive win over James Blake and Mardy Fish. This is Davis' first time to play World TeamTennis.

### **Hartford FoxForce:**

Abigail Spears steps in for Meghann Shaughnessy on July 6 and July 7 (both matches in Hartford). Shaughnessy is expected to join the FoxForce lineup on July 8 in St. Louis.

#### **Abigail Spears:**

This 24-year-old San Diego resident has been ranked as high as #66 in singles (2005) and #50 in doubles (2006). Spears has won three WTA Tour doubles championships since joining the tour in 2000. She won the ITF event in Japan earlier this year, bringing her ITF titles totals to five singles and eight doubles championships.

### **Houston Wranglers:**

Graydon Oliver, who last week was picked up by the Philadelphia Freedoms, was traded to the Houston Wranglers. Oliver steps in for Johan Landsberg on July 6 in Houston. Landsberg is out for the season.

#### **Graydon Oliver:**

Oliver has won four doubles titles on the ATP Tour and is currently ranked #86 in doubles. The 28-year-old Floridian most recently won the ATP doubles title in Indianapolis last summer with Australian Paul Hanley.

### **Kansas City Explorers:**

American Scott Doerner will fill in for David Macpherson on July 8 when the Explorers travel to Newport Beach. Lilia Osterloh replaces Caroline Wozniacki on July 7 (in Kansas City) and July 8.

#### **Scott Doerner:**

Doerner, 22, of Melbourne, Australia, recently finished a stellar season at Pepperdine University as he led the Waves to a 31-6 record and a #2 national ranking. Last month Doerner was named to the 2006 ITA All-America Team in both singles and doubles. Doerner posted a runner-up doubles finish at a 2005 Futures tournament in Mexico. Doerner is making his WTT debut.

#### **Lilia Osterloh:**

The 28-year-old American has won one WTA Tour doubles title since turning pro in 1997. Osterloh, who lives in Columbus, Ohio, has also won two ITF singles titles and five ITF doubles championships. She is currently ranked #109 in singles and #175 in doubles on the WTA Tour.

### **Newport Beach Breakers:**

Jeff Tarango will replace Rick Leach for the Breakers' matches on July 6 (@ Springfield) and July 8 (in Newport Beach). Leach returns to the lineup beginning July 10 in Newport Beach.

#### **Jeff Tarango:**

Tarango, 37, has won 2 singles titles and 14 doubles titles on the ATP Tour since turning pro in 1989. Tarango has been ranked as high as #42 in singles (1992) and #10 in doubles (1999). Prior to joining the pro tour, Tarango led Stanford to two consecutive NCAA Championships (1988, 1989). While at Stanford, Tarango was named to the All-America Team three times in singles and twice in doubles. Tarango played for the Hartford FoxForce in 2003.

### **Philadelphia Freedoms:**

American Chanda Rubin returns to tennis for the first time in nearly a year for a week-long stint with the Philadelphia Freedoms of the WTT Pro League presented by Advanta filling in for Lisa Raymond who will miss the first week of the season. Jim Thomas will fill in for Daniel Nestor on July 6 and 7.

#### **Chanda Rubin:**

Rubin, who has been ranked as high as #6 in the world in singles and won 7 singles and 10 doubles titles on the WTA Tour, underwent knee surgery in 2004 and was able to only play three events in 2005 before she was sidelined by ankle surgery. Rubin will play for the Freedoms on July 6 (@ Houston), July 7 (in Philadelphia), July 10 (in Philadelphia), July 11 (@ Boston) and July 12 (@ New York Buzz).

#### **Jim Thomas:**

This 31-year-old resident of Canton, Ohio, is one of the top American doubles players today. Thomas has won five ATP doubles events and is ranked #35 in the world in doubles. Thomas' most recent win was earlier this year in Portschach, Austria, with Paul Hanley. Thomas played four years at Stanford, earning All-American honors his senior year.

### **Sacramento Capitals:**

American Bethanie Mattek will replace Sacramento Capitals standout Elena Likhovtseva on July 6 (@ Delaware), July 8 (@ New York Sportimes) and July 9 (@ Boston). Likhovtseva, along with Mark Knowles and Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova, will return to the lineup beginning with the July 11 home opener against the St. Louis Aces in Sacramento. Brandon Coupe will fill in for Mark Knowles on July 6, while Travis Parrott replaces Knowles on July 8 and 9.

**Bethanie Mattek:**

Since turning pro in 1999, the 21-year-old Minnesotan has won one doubles title on the WTA Tour. Mattek has also won three ITF singles titles and three ITF doubles championships. She is currently ranked #103 in singles and #49 in doubles, a career high doubles ranking. Mattek most recently turned heads at Wimbledon with an unusual fashion statement during her first round loss against Venus Williams, memorably sporting knee-high socks, short shorts and a tube top over a halter top (all in Wimbledon-appropriate white).

**Brandon Coupe:**

The 34-year-old American has been ranked as high as #62 in doubles (1999) and has won one doubles title on the ATP Tour. Coupe partnered with Justin Gimelstob in 2005 to win the Yuba City Challenger doubles title. This is Coupe's first time to play in the WTT Pro League.

**Travis Parrott:**

Travis Parrott got his first exposure to World Team Tennis action last fall when he filled in for the Sacramento Capitals during the WTT semifinals. Parrott, 25, couldn't help the Caps get past the semis in 2005, but he's back in a sub role for two early season matches, July 8 and 9. The Atlanta resident has won one doubles title on the ATP Tour (Los Angeles, 2003) and is currently ranked #45 in the world in doubles. Parrott also captured two Challenger doubles events (Nashville in 2004 and Sunrise, Fla. in 2005).

**Springfield Lasers**

Springfield's Victoria Azarenka will miss the Lasers home opener on July 6 due to illness. Former Lasers player Kaysie Smashey will sub for Azarenka for the match.

**Kaysie Smashey:**

Smashey, of Austin, Texas, has won four ITF doubles titles, including two in 2005. The former University of Texas standout played for the Springfield Lasers in 2005.
